"Speak Kindly"

Kind words bring happy results. Unkind words bring unhappy results.

Try to avoid unkind words that ridicule, shame, or label children. Being called "big babies" or "bad" makes children feel disliked. Worse, they may begin to dislike themselves and "live down" to such labels as "liar" or "thief".

Unkind words don't help. They only make matters worse.

Kind words, on the other hand, help children behave better, try harder and achieve more. They communicate love and respect. They help create an atmosphere where problems can be discussed openly and understandings reached.

Suppose, for example, that a child has spilled his milk. You can say, "Don't be so clumsy! Look at the mess you made." —unkind words which lead to unhappy results. Or you can take a deep breath and say, "Here's a sponge. Please help wipe up the milk." —kind words which lead to happy results.
